Message: Live In Peace!

1 Thessalonians 5:13

In Christ, we experience peace with God. Romans 5:1 tells us; *Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.*

But how do we live in peace considering there is a battle for souls and a spiritual battle every day? What did Paul mean in 1 Thessalonians 5:13b; *Live in peace with each other.*

First, Paul is addressing believers to live in peace with each other and with church leaders. As a body of Christ, we have a responsibility to live in peace with one another. The church has a great mission to complete and the last thing we want to do is get caught up into disagreements and conflicts which can take our focus, time and energy away from working on God's mission of redeeming people.

Therefore let us strive to live in peace personally and in our relationships with each other.

Romans 12:18, *If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone.*

Why we should live in peace:
